
We would like to express our deepest appreciations for your thoughtful expression of concern, friendship and various assistances from all over the world during these difficult times for Japan.

We all combine our efforts as a team and raise hopes for the disaster victims. By doing so, we would like to accomplish the complete recovery of the whole of Japan.








